

Have you formed a committee?

Supervisory Committee

your immediate supervisor (Chair/co-Chair)+3 faculty in Physics+ 1 external member

Rationale: complementary expertise, advise, resolving of student/faculty conflicts, unforeseen circumstances

Advantages for you: certain commitment on behalf of your supervisor (*not* a guarantee for PhD!); more resources of expertise

Annual review of your progress

plus you can take as many "supervised research classes" PHY7979,7980 as you like

Distribution requirement: finished by the end of Y3

- You must take at least three (3) advanced (>6000 level) in three different subfields of physics.
- Example: 1) Solid State I; Solid State II, Modern Condensed Matter. Scanning Tunneling Microscopy (EE), etc.
 - 2) Standard Model
 - 3) Gryogenics

Classes can be taken outside the Department



Take more advanced courses

Get into research full speed

Complete the distribution requirement

Pass the ORAL EXAM

Have you passed the oral exam?



Oral Exam written part: research paper oral part: presentation

- Do I need to have original results for the oral?
- No! (although it would not be held against you)
- You need to demonstrate
 - a) basic understanding of your field of research;
 - b) knowledge of the literature;
 - c) solid research PLAN towards your PhD

Therefore, there is NO reason to postpone the oral exam!

Late registration/appointment forms

The deadlines from now on will be treated as ABSOLUTE. Every late application will be considered by the Graduate Coordinator, who may request a written petition from the student.

This petition will have to be co-signed by the student's supervisor/mentor.

To international students traveling outside US:

- If you leave the country, you need to re-apply for a visa
- Allow plenty of time for the process
- Get a letter documenting your registration in Physics and take it with you to the US consulate at the country of your destination
- TA/GA need to be on campus during the entire semester including the exam days
- Discuss your travel plans with your main course professors for both current and next semester prior to booking your tickets
- Full RA/fellowships: discuss your travel plans with your supervisor
- Students do get stuck!

Courses on demand

- Department encourages student input in forming a selection of advanced topic courses
- Those need to be planned in advance
- Make your recommendation to GSAC no later than the second week of the Spring semester
- Two petitions last last year (Early Universe and Qualitative Methods of Theoretical Physics): both granted

Letter to Congress: Students' Sequestration Concerns

September 15th, 2012

Dear House and Senate Leaders and Members:

We, the undersigned XX thousand students, are concerned about our future as scientists and engineers in America. On January 2, 2013, with no further legislative action, sequestrations will reduce the federal support of science by 9 percent, a reduction of more than \$15 billion at a time when other countries are prioritizing scientific investment. While we must adopt practices to live within our means, we must not do so by compromising our future prosperity.
